A Long Update from The WMA Museum

Dear Fellow Alumni and Friends of Wentworth:

I write to you with an update on our efforts to-date to establish the Wentworth Military Academy Museum.

I am pleased to report we have <u>a lot</u> of positive information to convey. Since the announcement of the closing of Wentworth, we have been working to secure our physical and digital historical artifacts in numerous ways. Our progress has been achieved through multiple coordinated efforts, including the successfully resolved Alumni Association lawsuit, a strong effort by the Association and Museum at the in-person and online auctions, and by hundreds of amazing acts of kindness by alumni and non-alumni alike.

The Doughboy

Pursuant to the lawsuit settlement agreement, The Doughboy, pedestal, and plaques attached thereto, were declared to be the property of the Alumni Association. Unfortunately, however, after many inspections by monument experts, it has been determined that the pedestal is not salvageable. After nearly 100 years, it is not in any condition to survive relocation. We have all the measurements, and when it is relocated to an outdoor location, the pedestal will be replicated as it appeared on campus. The Doughboy (and dedication plaques) are being temporarily housed in the WMA Museum.

As part of the settlement, the Alumni Association agreed that The Doughboy will remain the property of the Association until such a time as the Alumni Association can no longer provide for its safekeeping, at which point, The Doughboy will be donated/given/loaned to an alternate location, but The Doughboy shall never be transferred or sold into private hands so that it could be the personal property of any individual.

To that end, in February, an 11-person Museum Committee convened to take on the task of making a recommendation regarding The Doughboy's next home. By a vote of 7-3, the Committee recommended the Doughboy be placed on permanent loan to Lafayette County to be displayed on Courthouse lawn in Lexington (along with the WMA cannon). The vote on the first roll call was 6 for the Courthouse lawn, 2 for inside the WMA Museum, and 2 for the World War I Museum. There is a two-hour video of our deliberations on Facebook should you choose to watch it. The Committee's recommendation was forwarded to the Alumni Association for its consideration. By a vote of 4-1, the Executive Committee of the Alumni Association voted to adopt the 11-person Museum Committee's recommendation. It is our expectation at this point that The Doughboy will be unveiled at its "new home" at Homecoming in October.

WMA Museum vis-a-vis the WMA Alumni Association

As you may be aware, the Museum had been working on formalizing a separate legal entity for the WMA Museum. The formal paperwork for this effort was submitted in early January and effective Jan. 10, 2018, The Wentworth Military Academy Museum was approved by the IRS for 501(c)(3) status.

Externally, the WMA Alumni Association and the WMA Museum may be indistinguishable to most alumni on a day-to-day basis. Internally, however, the two organizations will operate differently. For instance, the Alumni Association will be in charge of coordinating Homecoming, staying in touch with alumni, planning musters, etc. Importantly, unless formally transferred to the Museum, the Association will own all the memorabilia housed in the Museum that was acquired via the auction or legal settlement. The Museum 501(c)(3) organization will own (eventually) the building and maintain, preserve, chronicle, catalogue, archive, and display all the Alumni Association artifacts (as well as additional artifacts donated or placed on loan to the Museum).

The executive officers of the museum are: George Hittner (chairman), James Lowman (vice-chair), Scott Hefner (treasurer), Jennifer Teichman Kerr (secretary), Mark Chitwood (member at-large), Catie Ebert (member at-large) and Sam Ratcliffe (member at-large).

Additionally, the Executive Committee of the Museum voted unanimously in January to establish an at-large body of voting Museum Members. These members will have an annual meeting which will take place at Homecoming every October; and the Museum Members will have the ability to select the officers of the museum (and other powers as may be delegated to them by the by-laws of the Museum).

The criteria for being a museum member will be becoming a member of either the 1880 Sustaining Member Society (see additional information under "Museum Giving" in this newsletter) or the Sam and Caroline Ratcliffe 1880 Lifetime Membership Society. Museum members will earn voting privileges as long as they have been a member of the 1880 Sustaining Member Society for at least 6 months. You do not need to be a Wentworth alumnus to be a museum member.

Museum members will also receive benefits (such as discounted room rates at the Wentworth Hotel, discounted rental prices for the Hall of Honor, recognition at the museum, on the website and in our newsletter, etc.).

Museum Giving

To all WMA alumni who complain about never-ending fundraising requests, I apologize in advance for this section of the newsletter. The reality is, however, that the money to put this all together simply is not going to fall out of the sky. We have endeavored to make museum giving possible for all alumni and friends of Wentworth across all financial spectrums.

The museum began its fundraising efforts in earnest following the successful resolution of the lawsuit and the accompanying significant acquisition of WMA artifacts. Our first goal was to create a sustaining fund, which has become known as the 1880 Sustaining Member Society. Members of this group have committed to donating at least \$18.80 a month "infinitely." Our goal was to achieve 137 members (one for every year of Wentworth). We were fortunate to cross that threshold in January.

Many Volunteers

Turning now to our amazing volunteers, I can say without hesitation that they have been amazing, and that we owe much of our success to a select few. We can always use more on-the-ground help! On the evening when the settlement with Bank



Midwest and the auction company was achieved, I put out an emergency call to friends and alumni to come to campus and help us remove our memorabilia, memorial displays, plaques, pictures and the like off campus. We had less than 24 hours to get things packed up, disassembled and moved so the auction company could reset the inventory in time for the live auction to proceed as scheduled. I have seldom seen folks answer the call in such a way. Old Boys and non-Old Boys showed up and worked relentlessly to accomplish the objective. It was well past midnight before the last of our volunteers left; and many of them they were back on campus first thing in the morning to help load up the moving truck and unload our items into the museum. On the day of the in-person auction, the same thing happened. It was absolutely impressive.

We cannot begin to acknowledge the volunteers who have dedicated their time, professional services and talents to help make all of this a reality. While there is

no doubt their volunteer efforts serve for many as a method of grief channeling for the closing of Wentworth, the primary motivation for our volunteers is the shared vision of what the future will hold for the WMA Museum. Some of the most amazing observations have been the time and effort contributions we have received from folks who are <u>not</u> Wentworth Alumni. At the top of this list is Jennifer Teichman Kerr who was on the legal team with me and has not only donated her services, but spent her own money, coordinated many of the day-to-day on the ground volunteer efforts, helped us locate the museum building, and on, <u>and on</u>. We owe her a debt of gratitude that will never be able to be repaid. We've also been fortunate to receive thousands upon thousands of dollars in in-kind services from local businesses who moved all of the class monuments, and The Doughboy with extraordinary professionalism and care. And finally, our volunteers are not just Old Boys, they also include folks who are mothers and fathers former cadets, spouses of former cadets, former faculty members, and people who are otherwise total strangers to Wentworth, but who believe in what we are accomplishing.

The Museum Building

The museum will occupy what are three adjacent storefronts in downtown Lexington: 1122-1128 Main Street. The purchase price of these combined buildings is \$175,000. The museum has been renting two of the three buildings since September, and we are pleased to announce that we closed on the building on March 30th. The buildings are ours.

Current plans for two of the three storefronts will be for the exclusive purpose of displaying artifacts and an event space, while the building located at 1122 Main St. is yet to be determined, other than serving as the kitchen/prep space for events in the Hall of Honor at the Museum. In the future, it is possible that we may rent the 1122 Main St. facility to a local entrepreneur to open "Dragon Den" type of establishment (fully equipped with WMA décor). However, determining what will eventually happen with the ground floor of 1122 Main St. is our lowest priority and all to be decided at this point. The basement will be used to expand the current basement of the museum is currently being used for storage, sorting and archiving WMA artifacts.

Here is some history on the building: The main building of the Museum is located at 1128 Main St., formerly known as the Hix Brothers Building. In the late 1800s, the building was home to a four-story commercial hotel, as well as a ticket office for the railroad. The hotel stood until 1907 when it burned to the ground. In 1908, John Hix "bought a hole in the ground" and built the current two-story building. He and his brothers, Dow and Arch Hix, operated a general merchandise and dry goods store until 1954 when the business was purchased by their great nephew and his wife, Maury and Patricia Cox. Patricia Cox's parents, Harry and Hazel Lauer later purchased the building and enlarged it, operating the store as Cox's Department Store. In 1972, they sold the operation to Morris Cox's first cousin, John Morris and his wife Betty, who operated the store for a few years before Morris and Pat Cox took over again and renamed it Cox Corner. In 1982, Frederick Tempel, a greatnephew of the Hix brothers and also a first cousin of Morris Cox, purchased the store. Frederick is a WMA alumnus, class of 1967. Over the next 20 years of ownership by Mr. Tempel and his wife Abigail, the store was enlarged and redesigned to include what had been Estrin's Jewelry Store at 1126 Main St. (now the WMA Museum Hall of Honor). Mr. and Mrs. Tempel closed the store at the end of 2000, after 92 years of continuous family ownership. The property was then sold to Robert and Margie Langdon. They re-opened the building as the Lexington Antique Company, purveyors of fine European antiques, holiday items and children's wear.

Artifacts and Memorabilia

As part of the settlement and the Association/Museum's effort during the in-person and online auctions, the <u>vast</u> majority of WMA historical documents, artifacts, photographs, paintings, stone and marble class walls, plaques, and memorabilia have been secured by Alumni Association/Museum. I am also pleased to report that two benches, the Ratcliffe family light post, and a row of seats from the Chapel have been secured. They are currently being preserved, categorized, chronicled and inventoried by scores of volunteers at the museum. Although it is a wild estimate, I do not believe it is an overstatement to claim that the museum is currently housing more than million WMA artifacts of varying significance. It is going to take some time to sort through everything.

Be that as it may, we fully recognize that we need to both be transparent and responsible in how we are planning to care for our shared history. Specifically, at some point in the future, all Alumni will pass on and join that glorious WMA cadet formation on a big quadrangle in the sky. As responsible stewards of our history, we need to, at minimum, face the fact that a long-lasting WMA Museum may, or may not be sustainable. In other words, we need to hope for the best, but plan for the possibility of sunset (perhaps on the 200th anniversary of WMA). To that end, once the sorting is complete, we will immediately embark on our plan to create a contingency plan for every single artifact.

Accordingly, the Museum has formed an 11-person Legacy and Artifact committee. Five of these 11 members will make up the Artifact Sub-Committee which will make recommendations for the current placement (i.e., museum display, museum archives, artifact loans to other museums or institutions, etc.) of all memorabilia. This entity will also be responsible for tracking every artifact the museum obtains by donation, purchase, or otherwise and where that item currently resides. A different five people from the 11-person committee will serve on the Legacy Sub-Committee. This Committee will be responsible for making recommendations for the future/final location of each artifact (where each piece will go when we decide to finally dispose of an artifact or the Alumni Association and Museum come to their natural conclusion). This could be returning artifacts to families, donations to other museums, disposition to Alumni, or other possible alternatives (think of this as our last will and testament committee).

The Body of the Whole (the entire 11-person committee) will convene only to vote on major issues/recommendations. The chairman of the Committee of the Whole will serve as an umpire, and will cast a vote only in the event of a tie.

Artifact Donations

The museum has been fortunate to have been given or otherwise received on permanent loan several critically important artifacts, including the original Wentworth bell (which was remove from above the Chapel) which dates back to the 1880s, the Hall of Honor display cabinets (previously located in Groendyke Hall), nearly all campus building bronze dedication plaques/awards, various class rings that will be a part of our "one ring from each class" display, etc. Unfortunately, the Griffin and Mooney memorials were not obtained via the online auction. However, they are going to fabulous new homes. If you are interested in donating artifacts to the Museum, please contact us first. We need to be careful to not accept duplicate donations of artifacts and we cannot serve as a repository for every WMA collection out there looking for a new home.

The Museum Store

A WMA Museum online store has been established. The store will serve raise funds for the museum for multi-duplicate items (i.e., yearbooks, clothing, WMA brass, etc.) and specialty items that are commissioned by the museum from time to time. The museum has set aside 3 copies of each of the yearbooks, and has made available for purchase the remainder of the yearbooks and 125th Anniversary book at the following prices: 1) \$30 per yearbook (plus \$7 shipping and handling; please allow 4-6 weeks for delivery); and \$60 for the 125th Anniversary Edition (plus \$7 shipping and handling; please allow 4-6 weeks for delivery).

The Wentworth Hotel

The top floor of the building is accessed by an exterior door that enters upon a stairway that leads to a current boutique hotel with four high-end rental rooms. Currently known as the River Town Inn, the Hotel will be renamed "The Wentworth Hotel" shortly after the museum closes on the mortgage and becomes the formal owner of the property. It will be decorated with excess items and memorabilia from the museum. The suites are nice, and have luxurious bedding, plush carpet, beautiful traditional decor, sitting areas, private baths, individual climate control and king or queen-sized beds. They also have mini-fridges, coffee makers, irons, ironing boards, hair dryers, cable television, alarm clocks, etc. These rooms will provide supplemental revenue for museum operations.

Historically, the space now occupied by the hotel rooms was formerly occupied (beginning in 1908) as offices and treatment rooms by Drs. Nicholas Payne and his son, Bryan Payne, as well as dentist Dr. William Smith and his son, Dr. Les Smith. The Payne medical practice closed in 1961. The younger Dr. Smith moved his practice to the south end of Lexington in the late 1970s after his father's retirement. Also historically occupying this space was the Selective Service office until about 1972, when the military draft ended.

Odds and Ends



- 1) Miniature Doughboys The museum is in the process of commissioning high-quality miniature Doughboys was as a way to thank the members of the Museum's Doughboy Society (individuals who have cumulatively donated \$10,000 or more to the museum). After an extremely positive reaction on social media, I contacted the artist to determine if they could make two different versions. These miniature Doughboys are not cheaply constructed; and the cost is primarily driven by casting the statue in solid bronze. The artist is now undertaking to two versions, which we are fondly calling "mini-Doughboy" and "mini-mini-Doughboy." We are adamant that quality of replicas of our beloved Doughboy not be compromised, and that the names of our fallen alumni that appear on the plaques always be able to be read. Since the Doughboy was the genesis of our museum effort, and since 1880 Society Members are our life blood, the Doughboys will be made available exclusively as a museum fundraising/revenue producer as follows:
- a. Members of the Lifetime 1880 Society will be afforded the opportunity to purchase one mini-mini-Doughboy for \$300.

- b. 1880 Sustaining Society Members will be able to purchase one mini-mini-Doughboy for \$500 after they have been a member of the 1880 Society for one full year, or upon payment of one full year of member dues (i.e., if paid all at once).
- c. Anyone else, including members of the public who are not Wentworth alums, will be able to purchase minimini-Doughboys for \$750, in any quantity.
- d. The larger miniature Doughboy will be reserved exclusively for museum donors who become members of the Museum's Doughboy Society. We are accepting pre-orders now. Anyone interested in purchasing a mini-mini-Doughboy should email chairman@wmamuseum.org.
- 2) Artifact Return: White Tiles The WMA Museum will begin the process of returning the "white tiles" that once hung in the Fieldhouse to alumni who have a legitimate claim to them. There will be a mandatory shipping and handling cost, and a suggested (but not mandatory) donation. All tiles that are not requested to be returned will be displayed on a wall at the museum.
- 3) WMA Crest Tile Floor We are excited to announce the museum's "on-order" mosaic tile floor. It will be a replica of the Wentworth crest and made from 74,236 10mm tiles in 19 colors, and span a total size of approximately 10 feet x 10 feet. The mosaic will be placed inside the Museum outside the theater and replica cadet rooms.
