#### **Board Talk**

#### Regis McDonald, Class of 1964 Chairman of the Board of Trustees



Wentworth has much to celebrate as it reflects on its 136<sup>th</sup> year. In May Col. Mike Lierman returned to take up his duties on a part-time basis. The Board and I ,along with all of the Wentworth family, are pleased and thankful that he is becoming physically stronger with each passing day. His spirit and commitment to Wentworth's future success remains undiminished! I and the board want to express to Lt. Col. Darren Fitz Gerald and the President's Cabinet our deep appreciation and gratitude for all that each did to make certain that the "business of Wentworth" moved in the right direction.

At the April BOT meeting, after a comprehensive presentation by Kent Stroman of Stroman & Associates, the board approved to move forward with the next phase of Wentworth's Capital Campaign. The BOT Development Committee will take on the responsibilities of a Capital Campaign Steering Committee. Doug Gourlay, BOT secretary and Bob Heath, trustee emeritus will co-chair the committee along with board members John Francis, Luke Coffey and John Groendyke, with Lt. Col. Marnie Morgan,

Wentworth's vice president of development and alumni affairs providing support. To advance the Capital Campaign Lt. Col. Morgan and six individuals will attend the Asking Academy this month conducted by Stroman & Associates. In future Board Talk articles, I will provide you with current information regarding the Capital Campaign. In the meantime, if you have questions or concerns, please let me know. The Capital Campaign is about Wentworth's future, so we all need to be involved.

A high point at the April BOT meeting at Wentworth was the dedication of a renovated/refreshed classroom in the Sellers-Wikoff Scholastic Building. I am pleased to report that the funds that made this possible came from the Mr. and Mrs. John Francis, Dr. and Mrs. Tom Francis, Doug Gourlay, and Steve Smith. Scott Hefner, president of the Wentworth Alumni Association, attended a portion of the BOT meeting and was able to be present for the classroom dedication event. It is anticipated in the coming months that all classrooms will be renovated, which is so important in order to be able to provide a 21<sup>st</sup> century learning environment for current and future cadets and civilian students.

On April 22<sup>nd</sup>, Lt. Col. Fitz Gerald and the Wentworth Battalion Staff attended the 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Wild About Harry Dinner in Kansas City. They had the opportunity to meet Dr. Henry A. Kissinger, the recipient of the Truman Legacy Leadership Award and have a picture taken with him.

In each Board Talk column, I mention the important work being done by Wentworth's Enrollment Management Department staff to recruit young people for Camp LEAD, the high School and college. This year, Wentworth launched a new marketing strategy directed at attracting youngsters to attend Camp LEAD and get a 100 per cent refund of the cost and have it applied to the tuition if they enroll in the high school for this fall. It is too early to know the exact impact this approach will have , but the numbers are up for those who plan to attend Camp LEAD, which opened on June 25<sup>th</sup> for the five-week session. Camp LEAD ends on July 29<sup>th</sup>. The staff is equally involved in recruiting cadets for the high school and college for the upcoming school year.

The 136<sup>th</sup> Commissioning and Commencement Ceremonies at Wentworth this year were extremely noteworthy! Maj. Gen. Jason T. Evans gave the Commissioning Address and the next day Maj. Gen. Barrye L. Price gave the Commencement Address. Major Gens. Evans and Price are 1981 graduates of Wentworth. Pictures of them at Wentworth for these ceremonies are featured on the Association of Military Colleges & Schools of the United States website at amcsus.org.





#### **ROTC TURNS 100**

Information in this article was obtained from remarks made during the Military Ball in April by Lt. Col. Grant Montgomery, Professor of Military Science at WMA.



This year is the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Army Reserve Officers' Training Corps.

The official start of the Army Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) began with the signing of the National Defense Act of 1916 by President Woodrow Wilson on June 3, 1916. While military training had been taking place in civilian colleges and universities throughout the U.S. as early as 1819, it was never formalized until the signing of the Morrill Act of July 2, 1862 when military instruction became a part of the curriculum in many colleges and universities throughout the U.S. By 1900, there were 42 state and local universities and colleges with a Military Science Department.

The first ROTC units appeared in the autumn of 1916 at 46 schools with a combined enrollment of some 40,000 Cadets. With units at 135 host institutions in 1919, the program en-

compassed 220 colleges and universities by 1940. Production also increased during this era. By the time the U.S. entered World War II, after Dec. 7, 1941, the ROTC had produced more than 100,000 officers and its graduates constituted about 80 percent of the Organized Reserve Corps.

During the U.S. Army's involvement in the Vietnam War, ROTC provided the Army with 104,545 second lieutenants, many of whom served as platoon and company commanders in Vietnam.

There are currently 1,709 Army JROTC units and 314,000 JROTC Cadets. JROTC has had an enormously positive effect on America's youth, helping young people from across the socio-economic spectrum. JROTC Cadets graduates have a much higher rate of graduation, have higher GPAs, and by-and-large turn into highly productive citizens. This is one of the largest leadership and citizenship-focused programs for youth in the nation. It is an investment in the future of our nation by helping our youth maximize their potential in pursuing their dreams, while developing into motivated citizens of great character and honor.

Army ROTC has 275 programs located at colleges and universities throughout the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico with an enrollment of 28,954 cadets. Last year 5,593 officers were commissioned.

Wentworth is proud to make available both the SROTC and JROTC programs with Maj. Ed Fiora in charge of the JROTC program.

I am honored to tell you that we have nominated Maj. Gen. Barrye Price and Maj. Gen.
