## SINCE EIGHTEEN EIBHTY

One of the chief reasons why Wentworth has been oble fo achieve its lofty purpose lies in the fact that the Academy has been under one continuous administration since its founding. For nearly three-score years, Colonel Sandford Sellers was president of Wentworth. He enjoyed one of the most enviable records in the history of American education.

The Academy was founded by Stephen G. Wentworth, scion of a distinguished English family and a prominent Lexington benker, in 1880, as a memorial to his deceased son. William Wentworth. Mr. Wentworth immediately vested control of the institution in the hands of a board of trustees composed of a duly elected reprasentative of each of the Evangelical churches of Lexington, and a president. Colonel Sellers was called to the new school in its first year and remained as its active head until 1938. Mr. Wentworth served as president of the Board from 1880 until his death in 1897.

It was the firm conviction of the founder, his board of trustees and President Sellers that a military boarding school provides the most effective possible means for giving young men the thorough mental, moral and physical training necessary to develop in them the highest traits of manhood. Thus, Wentworth became the first military school in the Missouri River Valley.

From the beginning the late President Sellers surrounded himself with the ablest faculty available - strong men of proved qualities and Christian character. Under his wise and forward-looking direction, Wentworth has grown steadily. Each year has shown morked improvement over the preceding year. Today Wentworth stands as one of the truly great educational institutions of our country - second to none in the opportunities it offers boys and young men for thorough preparation for professional studies, business and for life.

## AN HISTORIC BA CK CR I UN II

Throughout over half a century the Wentworth pourpose has remained unchanged. The ideals which led to the Academy's founding and which have carried it steadily forward, shine just as brightly today as ever: the desire to give each youth every opportunity to develop fully his own individual personality: the aim that every cadet shall acquire a keen sense of duty and responsibility, both to himself and toward others; that he shall have the mental and moral power to make accurate judgment between right and wrong and the physical power to stand by his convictions.

These high standards have dominated Wentworth for generations. But to maintain them and assure their full and continuous application, it has been found necessary to limit the enrollment. Wentworth today is a relatively small school-many times larger than in 1880, to be sure, yet small enough that every individual student is given the private attention so essentrial to his all-'round development.

The surrounding country affords a wealth of historically important Civil War sites and the town of Lexington itself retains much of the tradition of the old south. Here enthusiasm for the reminders of our country's glorious past is combined with the enthusiam for modern adventure to promote the rapid development of the boy's mental, moral and physical resources.

## TIIIIAY

The Wentworth Milifary Acadeny of today is vastly different from the Wentworth of 1880. From year to year it has enlarged its facilities, increased its enrollment and changed its physical appearance until there is little to remind one of the early days. Numerous modern and attractive buildings have been erected as they were needed. Old buildings have been torn away when they were no longer useful. Spacious military and athletic fields have been added. One of the finest Field Houses in the country has been built. Every new mathod in teaching that has been found definitely superior to older methods has been adopted, Yet, some of the fundomental principles that guided the first compony are adhered to just as strictly today.

## M I L I T A R Y IDEARTMENT



MILITARY troining at Wentworth has been a strang feature since 1895 when the first active army officer was detailed to the Academy but has never been permitted to interfere with scholastic work.

Today the Reserve Officer Training Corps program [ROTC] at Wentworth is administered by Regular Army personnel, consisting of three commissioned officers and six non-commissioned officers, who are in charge of instruction.

Cadets are taught the theoretical aspects of the basic military subjects through formal classrciom type instruction. Each Wednesday afternoon during the regular drill period the cadets apply those fundamentals learned. During the fall and spring of each school year the cadet corps participates in a field training program during the drill period. Initially, stress is placed on proficiency of the individual in such subjects as first aid, physical fitness and individual combat training. Later through instruction in combat formation, battle drill, patrolling and biyouac training. During the spring this training is culminated when the cadet corps participates in a field exercise which includes a tactical march and overnight bivouac.

Through parficipation in the ROTC six year Military Schools program, a cadet receives all necessary ROTC training to qualify for a Reserve Army Commission once he has attained a baccalaureate degree.

Wentwarth is proud to be one of the original Honar Schools of the United States, the highest rating given by the Department of the Army.

## IIEPARTMENT



The schalastic depariment is divided into two separate and distinct unitr the high school, which affers four years of preparatory work and the iunior college, which offors two years of lib. eral arts and science. Each has its own organization separate from the other. Both divisions are fully accredited by the North Contral Associotion of Colleges and Secondary Schools, an organization composed of the leading colleges and preparatory schooly in twenty states. This recognition means that qraduaten of eithar department are eligible to enter any institution in the United States that recolver students by cortification.

It is our aim to see that each codet masters every lesson thoroughly. To occomplish this, every student is taught correct study methods and thoroughly schooled in correct uses of libraries and laboratories. Classes are small, which permits individual attention. Most of the faculty members tive in the buildings with studente. They are readily accessible for special help. From time to time a porsonal study is made of each cadat to determine his points of weakness and help him overcome them.

## Aviation

Wenfworth participated lif the Fadaral Aoronauficx Admintitiation Clivilion Pilot Truining Program from its inception in 1939 through the changet to $\mathrm{C} . \mathrm{A} \cdot \mathrm{A}$ War Training Servico until June, 1841 , when all but 30 out of 712 collegot and univercitiss throughout the couritry were ellminatad dus to cortailitent of this type of training. Hawever, the acodemy odminatration, bollowing oviation training to be very important now and in the fature to the youth of the nofion. socured permiution from F. A. A. affeish to continus flight training on a chillinn banis and at the erepensn of the traines.

Wantworth operated if conjunction with the Earl Haines Flying Service at the Lesington Airport ms a contified flying school fally approved by tho FAA. The flight troining program, incloding ground vehool, for furpames the minimum reguiraments sef forth by the Federal Aeranaufici Adininistration qualifying cadets for Private and Comurorcial Pilot Cerfificiatet. ## A T W E V T W II RTH

NO TWO days at Wentworth are quite the same, for a widely varied program of scholastic, military, athletic and other activities it used to keep the interest of the cadets af high pitch and their appetites for learning well whetted. Furthermore, no two students have quite the same duties to perform throughout any given day. There is, however, a definite routine that all cadets follow each day. It is used to instill perfect regularity and promptness in affendance upon all dufies prescribed for ono and all cadets alike.

While it requires some odjustments for new students to become accustomed to this routine, any sfight hint of monotony is soon lost in the kaleidescopic whirl of the school year.

To give parents and others a better insight, the following pages have been used to set forth, pictorially, the day's activities from Reveille to Taps, of a typical Wentworth boy whom we will designate as Cadet Harlan.

HERE is Harlan, a typical Wentworth cadet-a fine young Amer-ican-manly, scholarly and upright. His respect for duty and responsibility has won for him the rank of sergeant. He may have come from a large city or a very small town-that makes no difference to the democratic spirit that provails at Wentworth. He may be from a wealthy family or a family in meager circumstances-most of his classmates would never know, nor even be curious, unless he chose to tell them. But he typifies all the fine qualities of a deserving and ambitious youth as he goes through the tried and age-proved Wentworth process of becoming a real man, a real asset to himself, his family and friends, and society as a whole.

Harlan, like all the others, participates in many activities besides those shown. But let's follow him through a typical day.

"CANT GET 'EM UP." blows the bugler, but he does, and at 6:35 o clock another day is under way. Cadet Harlan goes first to the sanitary lavatory on his floor. A good washup is part of the routine, for a cadet is expected to keep him self clean at all times. At 6:50 he goes to a well-prepared breakfast.

After breakfast, rooms must be cleaned. One of the basic aims of our system is to form personal habits of order. Each morning Harlan makes his own bed, puts his clothes in order and helps his roommete clean the room.

Strict inspection of quarters is a daily routine. Formal inspection of Harlan's person, room and equipment occurs on Sunday morning. At this time unusual care must be taken in cleaning the room. Our friend sees that hidden comers are carefully dusted, chairs polished, and everything put in order. Then he takes care of his person. There's brass to shine, leather to polish, hair to brush, and whiskers to be removed. A certain time is allotted for this preparation and all work must be done within that time. This young fellow knows that any deficiency in this work receives what is known in Acaderrly language as a "skin"-which counts against one's company in color competition.

 ALISTHENICS play an important role in the physical education of Cadet Harlan. No effort is made to indulge in this or any other exercise in the early morning hours: when the body is at its lowest ebb. All such exercises are taken by our cadet after a hearty breakfast and morning classes. The exercises are intended to promote greceful movement as well as better health. The calisthenics used by the United States Army are followed. They are led by senior cadet officers.

So long as the weather permits, the calisthenics are held in the open, but they are taken in the large gymnasium, where on entire battalion may take part at the same time, when rain or cold is in the sir.

DRILL is a very formal affair. It is on the drill field that Harlan learns much of courtesy, discipline and alertness. He, with his entire battalion, is thorcughly schooled in good citizenship, taught the proper respect for superiors and trained in leadership.

Learning to drill a squad is the first training in leadership. Throughout the year squad drill and competition is a part of the regular military routine. The squad is the smallest military unit and consists of nine to twelve men, two of whom are sergeants. All instruction is conducted by cadets under the personal supervision of members of the military faculty.

Although military work takes but one hour each day, the training is intensive and much more thorough than that found in larger units. Personal attention is given the individual cadet on the military field as well as in the classroom, and each cadet has an equal chance to advance to importont positions in Wentworth's military realm. In the army, the navy and the marine corps Wentworth is glorified by its alumni who have received their commissions and are distinguishing themselves in official capacities of these respective branches of service.

TRAINING for leadership is important on the football field as well as everywhere else at Wentworth. More than fifty cadets answer the varsity call each year and large squads furn out for company teams. All players receive intensive training, both in the art of the game and in clean sportsmanship.

Football ranks as the number one sport and the Red Dragon elevens are consistent winners. The fine spirit of players and corps is credited with being a strong determining factor in every contest.

In the winter months basketball comes into the spotlight. Again there are the varsity and company teams and a place for every cadet who desires to play. Home games are played in the spacious field house where there are three courts and ample space for spectators.

Wentworth is a member of the Junior College Interstate conference; an athletic associtation numbering seven schools as members. The Wentworth High School teams are members of the Missouri River Valley conference at this time. Almost every major and minor sports are on the Wentworth program - all played under competent coaches and every cadet is required to participate.

## SPECIAL EVENTS MARKED THE 75th ANNIVERSARY OF THE FOUNDING OF WENTWORTH <br> During 1954-1955

Several special events were held, same pictured here. The first of these was to recognize Founders Day and honor the menory of Stephen G. Wentworth, the fonunder, and Col. Sandfond Sellers, the fint superintendent, who sereed as head of the Acalemy for 58 years. The speaker and lionored guest was ex President Harry S. Trmman, who addressed the Cadet Corps and the guests in attendance and later placed wreaths on the geves of the two men who were hosored. Mr. Truman was made an Honimary Colonel of the Wentwath Cadet Corps during the visit he and his wife made to the Acadeny.
The second cerent, although an annual one; out Wentworth show in Kansas City had the distinctive 75th Anniversary color.
The thind special eecusion was one which received nationwide publicty, a reenactment of the Battle of Lexington which
waurred in September of 1861 . Joining with the Cadet Corps in actually portraying the Battle were units from the regolar Ammy, the National Guard, and ROTC units of Kimsas City. The leading critizens of the City of Lexington, and in fact the whole community, josned in preparation for this ven unusual event. As much realism as phesible was achized, even including the vooperation of the elements because it rained continoously daring the day, May 12, 1955, on which this event was held, as it had during the actual Bartle, according to authentic records. Attending the event were many high ranking Army officers and other distinguishied citizens, which made it one of the most remarkable days in the entire hiseory of Wentworth Military Acadeny and of the City of Lexington.

With our annual Government Inspection com ing up next Monday, everybody spent most of today's drill periods get ting initial preparations talen carc of. Thil evening my roommate and I took supper pernits and went out to cat pizzi. I had floor chicf duty tonight so 1 didn't get mueb studying done:

April 13-Late BRC as usual. It started mining aguin today and I certainy bope this starm only lasts one day and not give like the last one. This evening the Cavaliers, our dance band, played for Lexington High School's JuniorSenior Prom, which was attended by a loe of other cadets.

April 30-The bays that are planning to come to Wentworth's Summer Camp this year ate lunch with the Corps in the mess hall and watelhed parade. This was the ribbon parade for the secood six weeks and my company won the Deportment and Scholastic ribboms. I couldan't do much this evening becouse I had floor chief duty, but I had an interesting talk with the O.C., about his military careec.

May 1-We started a block of instructions on the 81 M.M. meetar in military today. Our instructor is $\mathrm{S} / \mathrm{Sgt}$. Padilla; a new member of our miliary department and an excellent NCO. My geology class didn't meet this morning but I almost got caught with a popquix in jourmalism. After classe this afternoon, I helped the Director of Develogenent, Capt. R. H. Miller return some things he had borrowed.

May 2-This afternson during athletic period, my company softball team son its fint game, $10-9,1$ received a real nice birthday card from my mother with twenty dollars in it, during mail call, after lunch. This evening my company went to the Country Club to eat a steak dinner we won for having the best scholastic record this semester. After the kanquet I went to visit a faculty officer at his home. May 8-1 think I did real well in both the geology and accounting tests today even though 1 didn't have a chance to complete all of the test in acecounting. This evening I ate a real nice steak dinner at the Trumpeter saff bunquet. After evcryone bad finished the meal. Mr.

Fred Scllers, a former cadet here and son of Colonel Selless, president of our school, gave an interesting specch on progress that is being made and has bech made in the newspuper world. Mt. Sellers is a copy-reader with the Kunsas City Star and I Iearned a great deal from his speech.

May 9-This morning I bad unother three weeks test but this one was in journalism. Although it covered the last five chapters of our brork, it wasnt is hard as I had expected it to be. I decided to take an evening off from the books and went out to eat pizza and play cards with a member of the faculty. It was the first time I had ever played camasta and I really did enjoy it

May 10-During today's assembly a State Highway patmolman from Lee's Summit case and talked to us about sife driving. It was really filarious because no one could see the ball until it was right next to them because it was so dark.

May 16-This morting we had a spectial memorial service for the foue boys (three cadets and an airport employee) who had died in accidents during the current shool year. It was a very splemn ceremony for me because tho of them were personal friends of mine who 1 miss a great deal. This evening my company went to the Country club for a steak dinner for having had the best deponment moord this semester. During CQ.s I worked on my newspaper articles because I wanted to have them all done before final exams starn,

May 17-Due to the fact that we had a chapel wervice yesterday, there was no assembly toxlay and we all went to our regular fourth hour classes instrad. We ckaned our rifles for about an bour and then turned them in along with nur packs and equipment during drill. During CQs 1 started irudying for my Final examination in Goology. This seens to be my weakest cowrse and 1 really want to do well in it bexause it is a five semeser hoar course.

May 18-Late B.R.C. as usual. Today I had two frec hours before and after lunch so 1 get a lithe physical onditioning done with an fiomitric bar done in the morning and worked on two Accounting problems during the afternoon. A lot of the guys were out gatting sun tanned this aftemosn, but I can't afford to do that until finals are over because I seem to be getting a little behind on my studics,

May 19-This morning we took mortars outside for practical work in military class. I doo't know why bot I don't seen to be able to do much with a mortirr and it's a little embarrassing because it is not that complicated. This aftemoon our company softball team beat an A Company team, 17-4. (It sure was great to slaughter unother team because we really got beaten badly in our last gume.) I spent CQs getting my uniform and shoes all ready for a band trip tomorrow. We are going to Whiteman Air Force Base to take pait in Armed Forees Day festivities there.

May 20-This morning it 9 a.m., we baurded Air Forec buses for the band trip to Whiteman Ait Force Basc, It was drizzling when we left the Academy and it rained most of the day so a los of the events scheduled had to be cancelled. We trok prit in the dedication of a memorial and a base review und gave a small concert in the post theater before returning to Lexington late in the afternoon. This esening the Phi Theta Kappa fraternity showed Alfed Hitchecock's movic "The Bird" in the school chapel,

May 21-Today was "Ras" day, the day on which fint year hoys become "Old Boys" for a day and the "Old Boys" are trosted like "Rats" (or first year cadets). It wasn't really that hard, buit I'm not too sare I did very well on sume of the mure specific quentions. During today's ussembly period, I went to the fieldhouse where Colond Sellers gave us a brief talk on what college elsewhem wuald be like. May 25-This aftemoon I did real well on my six week exam in accounting and started studying for my final examinations. Tomorrow, I have finals in geology, economies, and American exonomic history plus a notebook to turn in. Unfortunately I haven't done enough studying for economics ore economic no I bope the tests arent tho hard.

It's really kind of hand to believe that there are only four days left in this school year and with finals over all I have to do is pack my stuff and take it ensy. This evening we had our spring athletic banquet in the dining room.

June 1 -Since 1 only had two clases today $I$ spent the morning pocking and the affernoon reading and relaxing My parents will be here for the Conmencement week end tomorrow sane time and Im really looking fonvard to seeving them wgein.

June 2-My folks got here late this afternoon and I shuned them all around the campus and introduced them to same of my buddies. Bruce, Doug, Jim, and I took pictures of the campos this morning and I hops they come out well because Fm, graduating from Junior Callige this Sunday and 1 won't be coming back to the Acudeny next yeat This evening, the band played the Commencement Concent in the field house.

June 3-This noon my folls went out to the Comery Club for the sisitor's lunchoon. Later on we had our annual awards assembly and I got a medal foe being Feature Editue of The Trumpeter. I spent the aftemoon with my folls showing them the school and the town. There are somes real pretty uld hums in this town that date hack to pre-Civil War Days. This evening we hid our anmual Commencement Dance in the field house. Everybody is really amous to leave now that Connmencement is tomorrow.

June 4-The big day is finally here. This moming we had bac calaureate exercies in the field house and boy it went slow. Commencement exertises started at $3: 00$ and was followed by the last parade of the year in which the Brigade Commander yelled "Brighde Dismised! !! !
