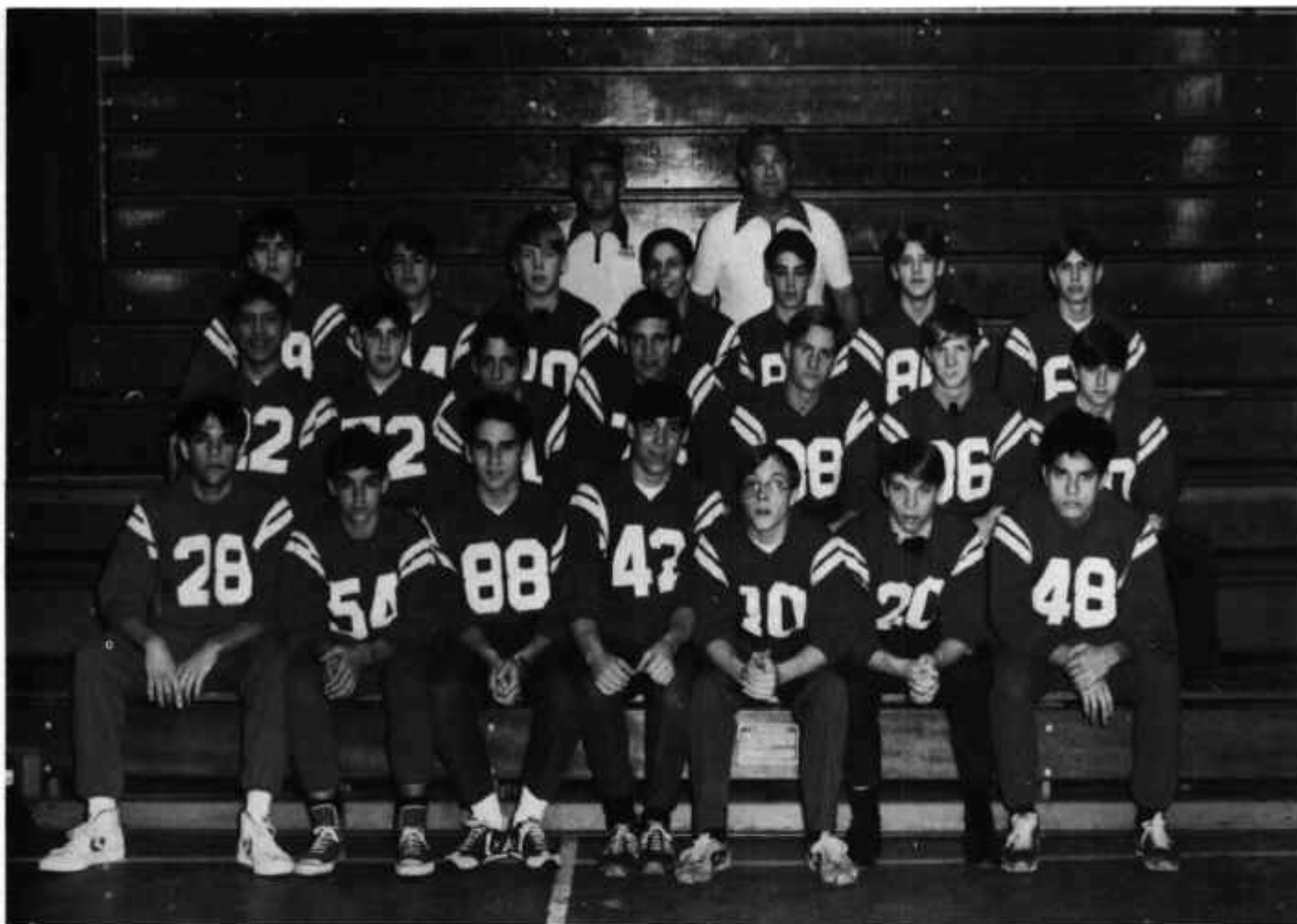

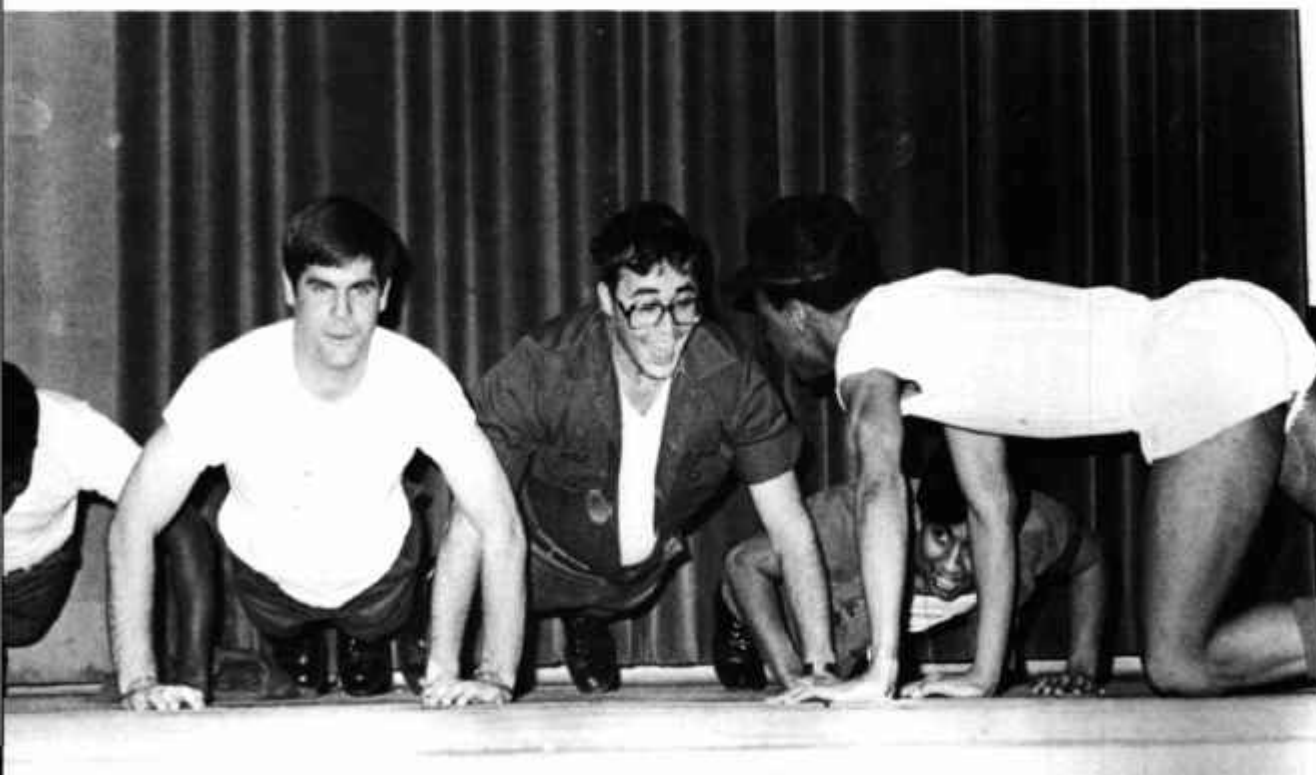

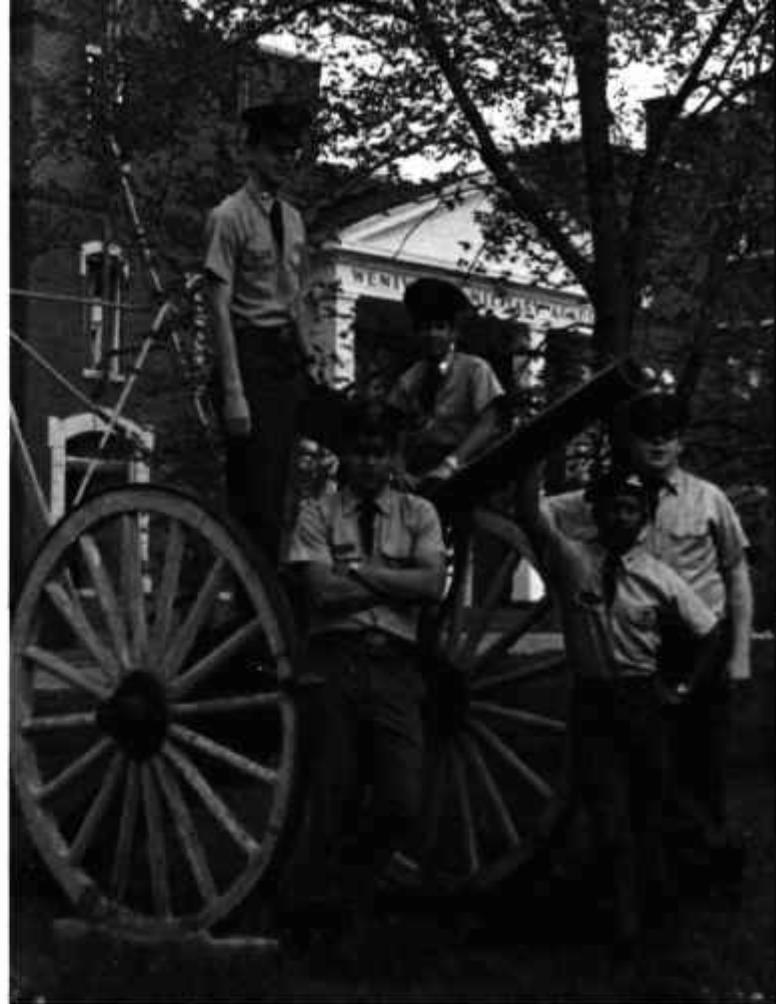
F troop discovered religion the day of the big blizzard. Everyone was praying that our roof would cave in so we could go home.
