

F troop discovered religion the day of the big blizzard. Everyone was praying that our roof would cave in so we could go home. The company staff learned how to tie a tie.



The band spent many hours in practice for a recording which will be available in the Quartermaster Store. The record includes parade music and features the Centennial Symphony composed by Capt. Kendall.




