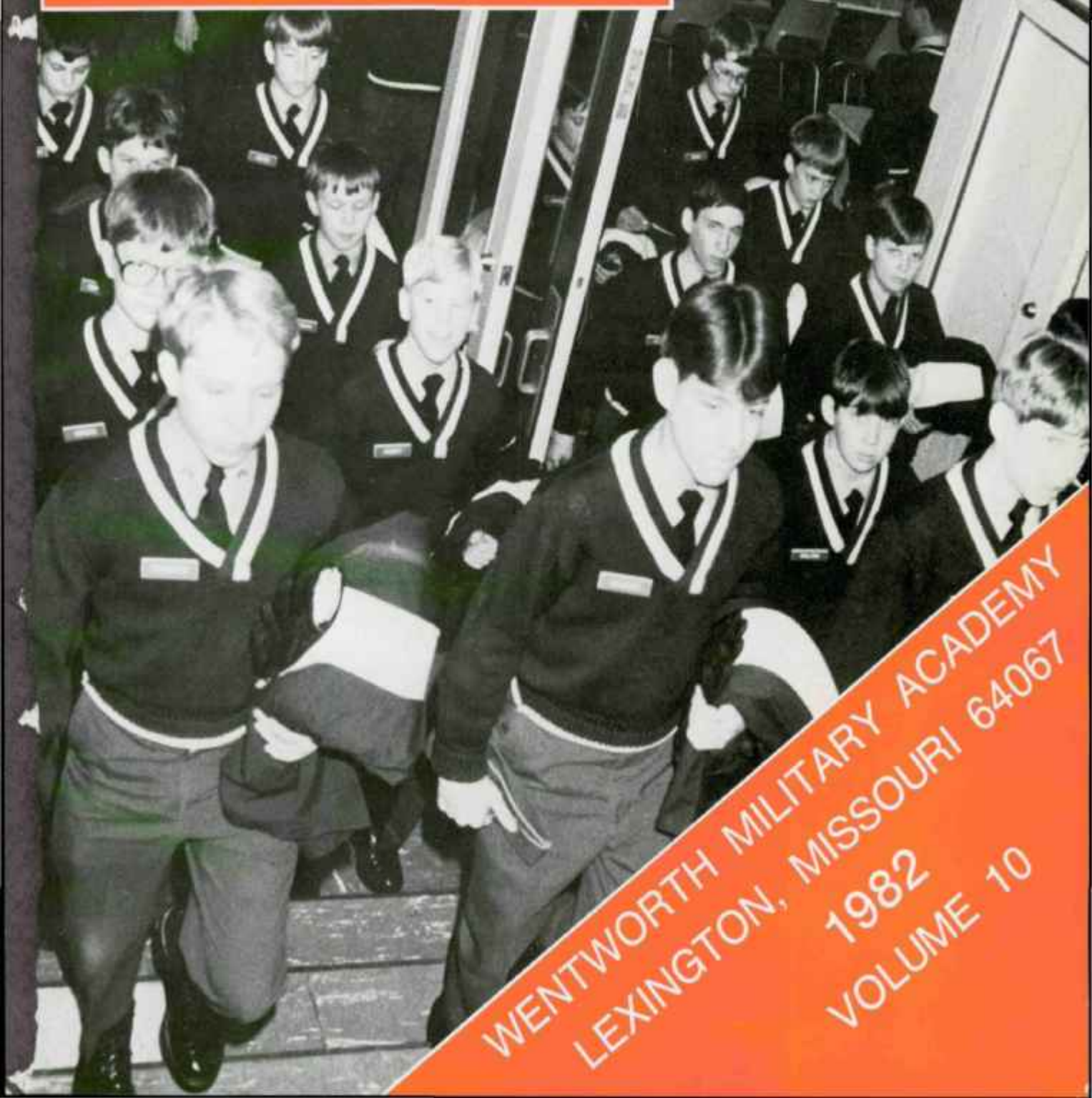

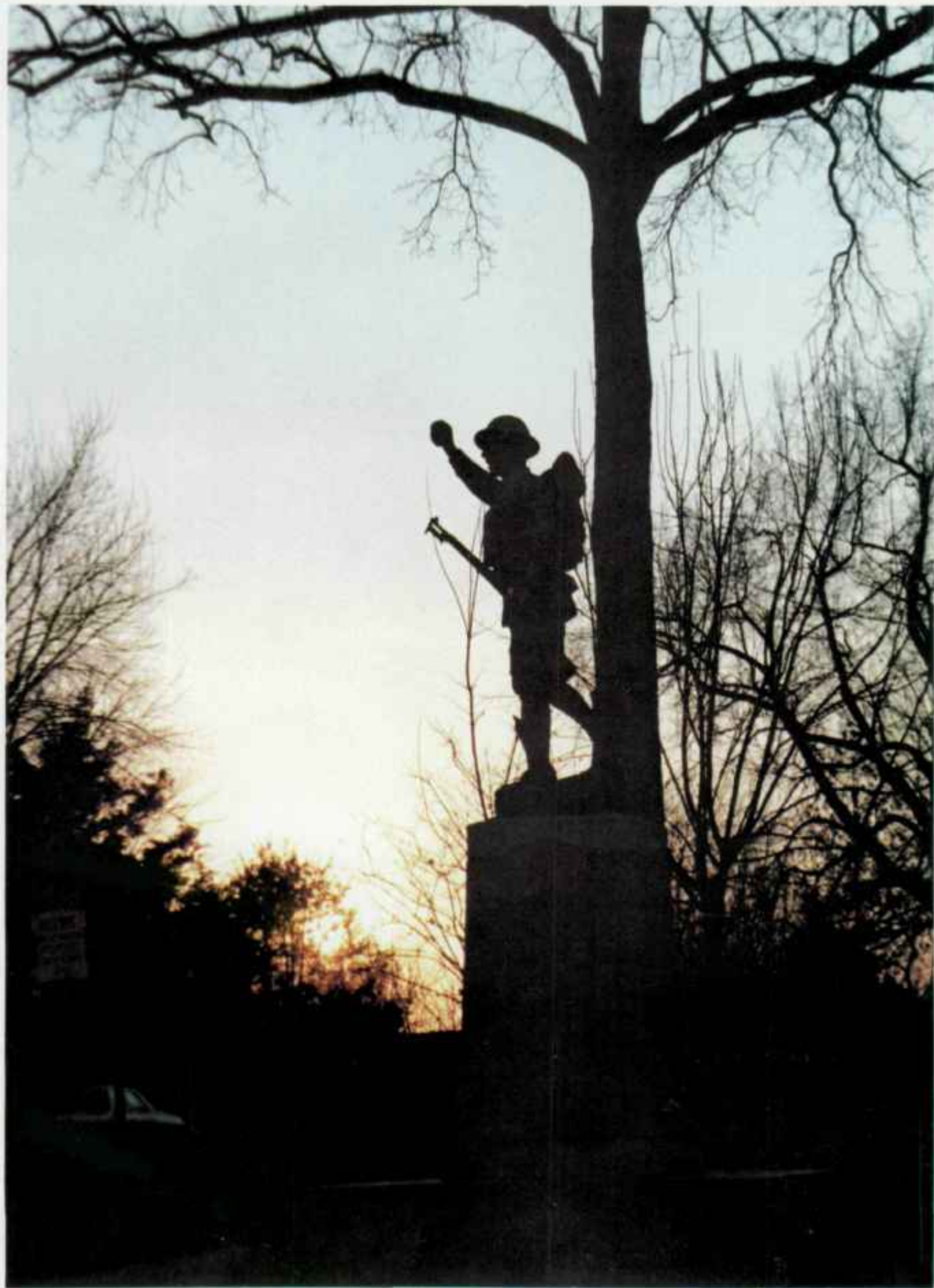
1981-1982, a new beginning

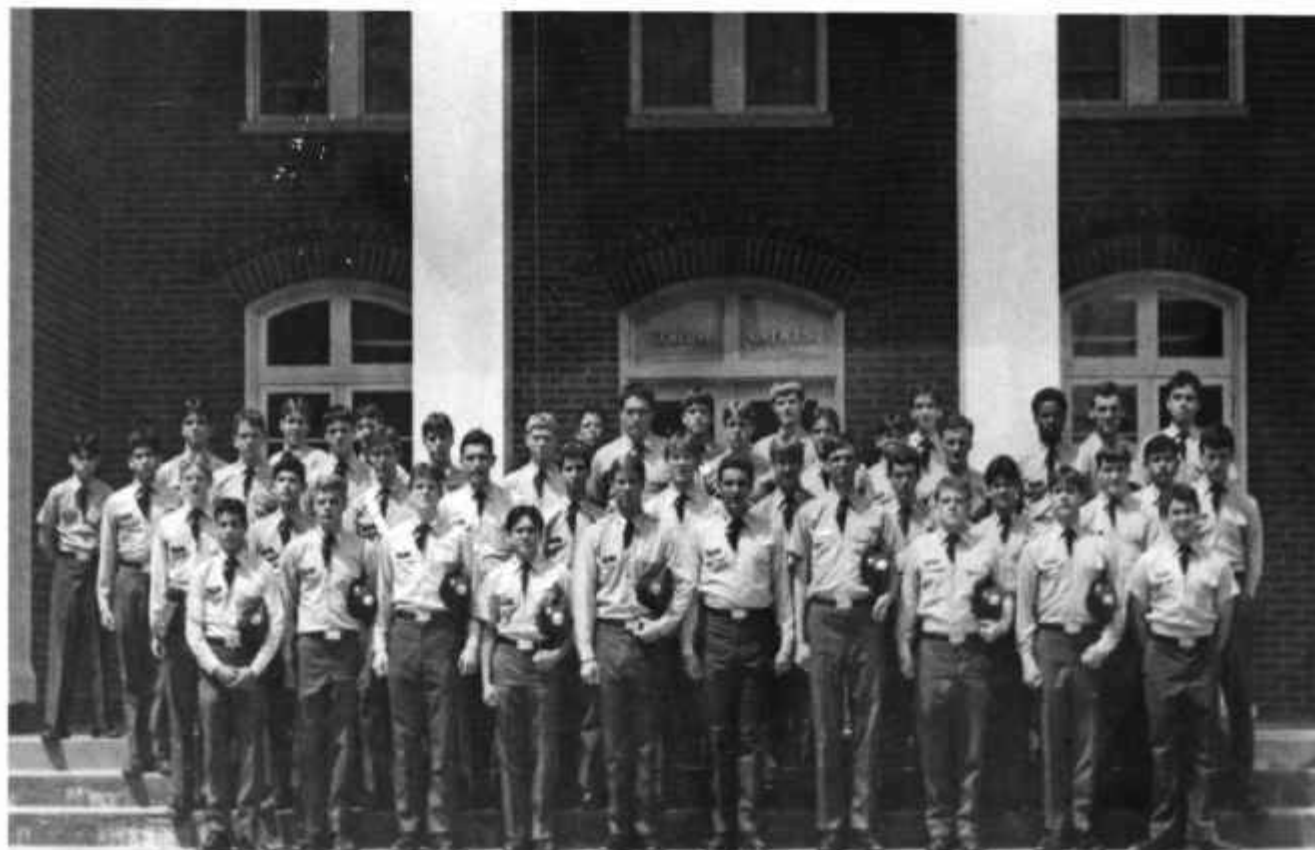
