## Phi Theta Kappa

In the spring of the year outstanding cadets are selected for membership in national honoraries. Requirements to belong are set by the nation organizations.

Phi Theta Kappa is a national junior college scholarship society open to 10 percent of the junior college. A minimum grade point average of 3.0 is a requirement.

## National Honor Society

National Honor Society requires a cumulative grade point average of 8.0 on an 11.0 scale. Members must be outstanding in scholarship, service, leadership and character. The organization is restricted to 15 percent of the senior class, 10 percent of the junior class and 5 percent of the sophomore class.

## Alpha Phi Omega

Alpha Phi Omega is a national college service fraternity. They work actively behind the scenes throughout the school year. They sell food and drinks at the ball games and at Mil Ball. They decorate for the Christmas dance. They fill pop machines in the barracks.
