YESTERDAY AND TODAY

The Wentworth Military Academy of today is vastly different from the Wentworth of 1880. Enrollment has increased and numerous attractive buildings have been erected as they were needed.

In 1981 a Second Century Development Fund was initiated to update the campus needs. A building plan was started where the fire of August 7, 1975, mercilessly left only a shell of what was old "D" Company. Along with it, the

band room, the rifle range, the military department, our maintenance department, and part of the administrative offices were lost.

Today with the support of alumni, parents and all of those who Wentworth holds a special meaning to, a new building is presently being erected.

Yet from year to year, Wentworth, as it always has, obtains one major goal: "To succeed in giving the best education it possibly can."

Each Thursday, after classes, cadets attend drill from three to five o'clock. During this two hour time span, we learn military skills such as repelling, first aid, bayonet training, to the employment of the M-17 protective gas mask. The drill classes are prepared and taught by Military Science III and IV students, supervised by the Military Department. This gives the MS students a chance to teach a class to other cadets while receiving guidance from experienced military personnel. This is important, since most of our MS students are on their way to a commission as a 2nd Lieutenant in the United States Army. Drill is both a learning and teaching experience for all. Drill can be a lot of fun, too!





The Sellers-Wikoff Scholastic Building, built in 1940, is still turning out well educated cadets, the result of the ceaseless efforts of some of the best educators in the teaching field. The building houses two departments--high school, a four year preparatory course, and junior college, two years of liberal arts and sciences. Both are fully accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Adjoining the scholastic building is Wentworth's beautiful Memorial Chapel. Not only is the Chapel a place for cadets to periodically join together in worship, but it is also the place where assemblies are held. Assemblies consist of informational topics, honors, awards and entertainment.

Classes are held Monday through Friday in the Sellers-Wikoff Scholastic Building starting at 7:50 in the morning. There are six periods a day, where a variety of courses are offered, many of which are required. The first four periods are in the morning, the last two in the afternoon. The morning classes are separated from afternoon classes by lunch, better known as DRC, and noon inspection. Cadets march in formation to the Quadrangle with their company, sounding off their mottos and chants.

When they reach the Quadrangle, Battalion Staff calls up the Corps and gives the order to Prepare for Inspection. Noon inspections consist of brass, shined shoes, appearance, uniform, hygiene and knowledge of "Fact Sheets". After inspection cadets march to the drum beat into the mess hall. After lunch comes the best part of the day for most cadets, "Mail Call".





Throughout over half a century the Wentworth purpose has remained unchanged. The ideals which led to the Academy's founding and which have carried it steadily forward, shine just as brightly today as ever: the desire to give each youth every opportunity to develop fully his own individual personality; the aim that every cadet shall acquire a keen sense of duty and responsibility, both to himself and toward others; that he shall have the mental and moral power to make accurate judgment between right and wrong and the physical power to stand by his convictions.

These high standards have dominated Wentworth for generations. But to maintain them and assure their full and continuous application, it has been found necessary to limit the enrolment. Wentworth today is a relatively small school--many times larger than in 1880, to be sure, yet small enough that every individual student is given the private attention so essential to his all-'round development.

The surrounding country affords a wealth of historically important Civil War sites and the town of Lexington itself retains much of the tradition of the old south. Here enthusiasm for the reminders of our country's glorious past is combined with the enthusiasm for modern adventure to promote the rapid development of the boy's mental, moral and physical resources.




At 6:20 the bells ring to start another day at Wentworth Military Academy. Cadets start their day by washing their face, brushing their teeth and combing their hair. At 6:40 they march on to breakfast, which starts the official beginning of the new day. After breakfast, general details must be done and rooms must be cleaned. One of the basic aims of our system is to form personal habits of order. Each morning, cadets make their own beds, put their own clothes in order, and help roommates clean the room.





The Mess Hall is the melting pot of Wentworth. Here cadets, faculty, and other members of the school staff gather around the table to eat. Meals at Wentworth are still served in the traditional family style. The food is not prepared by the school any more; now a professional company, specializing in serving big institutions, cooks the food serving annually approximately 1,260 meals. Regardless of the changes created by the passing of the years one can still see Col. Sellers, Sr. sitting with his wife at the head table and every now and then grasping the microphone and relating to the Corps one of his moralizing stories.




Junior High Track


Homecoming


