



Congressman Tke Skelton

Ike Skelton attended high school at Wentworth Military Academy in 1945. He returned to attend Wentworth Military Junior College in 1949 and graduated in 1951. He then attended the University of Missouri and the University of Edinburgh in Scotland. He became a lawyer and served as the Lafayette County prosecuting attorney from 1957 until 1960 and a special assistant attorney general. Skelton was a member of the Missouri Senate, representing Lafayette County from 1971 until 1977. From 1977 to 2011, he served as the United States Representative for Missouri's 4th Congressional District. He served as the Chairman of the House Armed Services Committee during this time. Ike Skelton died on October 28, 2013 at the age of 81. The visitation and funeral for Congressman Skelton was held on November 3 & 4, 2013 on the Wentworth

campus.

I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day-and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing.'

Lieutenant Jason Togi

First Lieutenant Jason P. Togi graduated from Wentworth Military College on May 22, 2010. The same day, he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant. While attending Wentworth, Togi was a member of the junior college indoor track team, Wentworth Honor Society, Phi Theta Kappa, and the International Club. He attained the rank of Captain in the Corps of Cadets. Jason joined the United States Army on September 15, 2011. He was deployed to Afghanistan on July 4, 2013 as an engineer platoon leader in Charlie Company, 2nd Brigade Special Troops Battalion, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 1st Cavalry Division. First Lieutenant Togi was killed on August 26, 2013 in Hasan Karez, Afghanistan, when enemy forces attacked his vehicle with a roadside bomb. A memorial service was held in his honor in the WMA chapel on November 10, 2013.



















Lefty is a former first basewoman and pitcher who played in the All-American Girls rofessional Baseball League from 1946-1951. Her career highlights featured pitching 42 consecutive scoreless innings in 1950, ne is the only female to get a hit off Satchel Paige in an All-Star Game in 1947. In the movie, A League of their Own, which was aspired by the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League, Lefty is played by actress Rosie O'Donnell.

1988, Lefty Hohlmayer was inducted in the Cooperstown Baseball Hall of Fame. Some of her other awards include: the 2nd nnual Great Sports Legends (1993), Lifetime Achievement (1997), induction into the Ohio State University Hall of Fame (2001), and selection to the Ohio State University All-Century Softball Team (2002).




