Wentworth College Satellites



In addition to our main campus in Lexington, Wentworth College also has three other locations in Missouri where students can take classes. For added convenience, Wentworth offers college classes at sites in Cameron, Lamar, and Hermitage.



For over 20 years, Wentworth College has served the community of Cameron, Missouri. A variety of classes are offered year round. The typical spring/fall enrollment at this site is 60. The Cameron site coordinator is Keith Mathews.



A partnership between Wentworth College and the Lamar area Vo-Tech Center has provided an educational opportunity to the community of Lamar, Missouri. This site started in Sheldon, MO over 20 years ago and then moved to Lamar in the early 2000s. The Lamar site typically has a spring/fall enrollment of 15. Students are offered year round classes, in a variety of subjects. The Lamar site coordinator is Sam Delaney.



Started by Gerda Fitz and Dennis McCulloch, the Wentworth College Hermitage site has awarded numerous college degrees. As with the sites in Cameron and Lamar, Hermitage offers a variety of classes year round. The average enrollment here is 25. The site coordinator in Hermitage is Ray Aubuchon.

In fall 2013, students from these sites accounted for about 30% of Wentworth's commuter enrollment and 17% of Wentworth's online enrollment.

Wentworth leases classroom space from the local high schools at each of the sites. In each of those school districts, there are numerous former Wentworth students working as instructors or administrators.

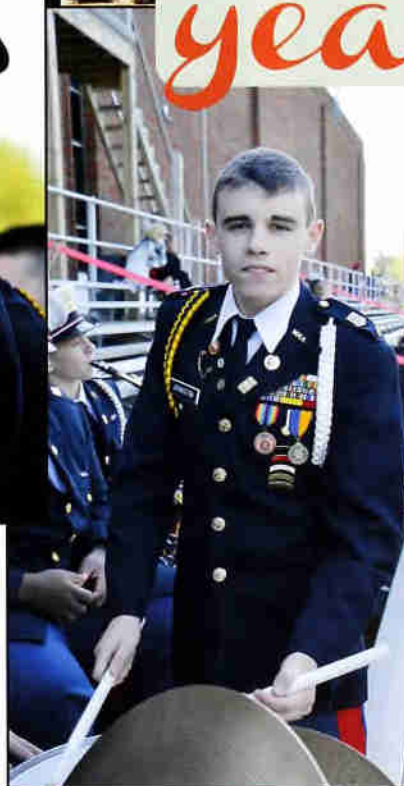

The Early Commissioning Program (ECP) is a 2-year program that allows college students to receive a U.S. Army commission as a Second Lieutenant upon graduation from Wentworth.

The ECP is tailored for individuals who have completed one of these three requirements:

- *Three or more years of Junior ROTC*
- *Leaders Training Course, a 4-week paid officer training program at Ft. Knox, KY*
- *Basic Training (with or without APT)*

Upon graduation from Wentworth with an associate's degree and a commission, recipients must complete their bachelor's degree at a four year college of their choice, and will also serve with a National Guard or Reserve unit while completing their bachelor's degree.

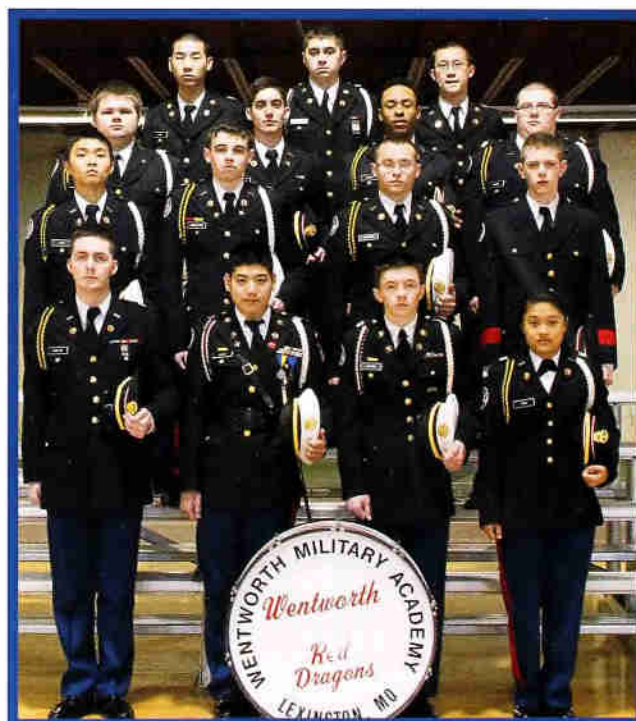

The Sounding of the Cannon



COL Lierman spoke of the people who would end up being most important in the lives of the cadets. "Most times it's the little things that make the biggest impact", said COL Lierman. "Wentworth is not the buildings, or seats you sit in. Wentworth is the people. You are one of those people."

COL Lierman went on to explain the history of the ceremony. COL Jerry Brown, former president of Wentworth Military Academy & College and now the Mayor of Lexington, started the ceremony in 1993 to signify the start of the school year and as a time to set goals and expectations. Congressman Skelton overcame many struggles in his life, and he finished every race he started. He was special to Wentworth and his message was "Achieve the Honorable."

COL Lierman finished with this quote by Lao Tzu, "Do the difficult things while they are easy and do the great things while they are small. A journey of a thousand miles must begin with a single step."



Mayor Jerry Brown invited the cadets to be part of "Legendary Lexington" and to participate in everything the community has to offer. "You are now part of the community and its history," Mayor Brown told the cadets.



C/LTC Justin Aldred, Battalion Commander, spoke to the Corps and thanked them for their service to Wentworth. He went on to say that we are a team and a family. We should motivate, help, and encourage each other. He then quoted part of the West Point Cadet Prayer, "Choose the harder right instead of the easier wrong."

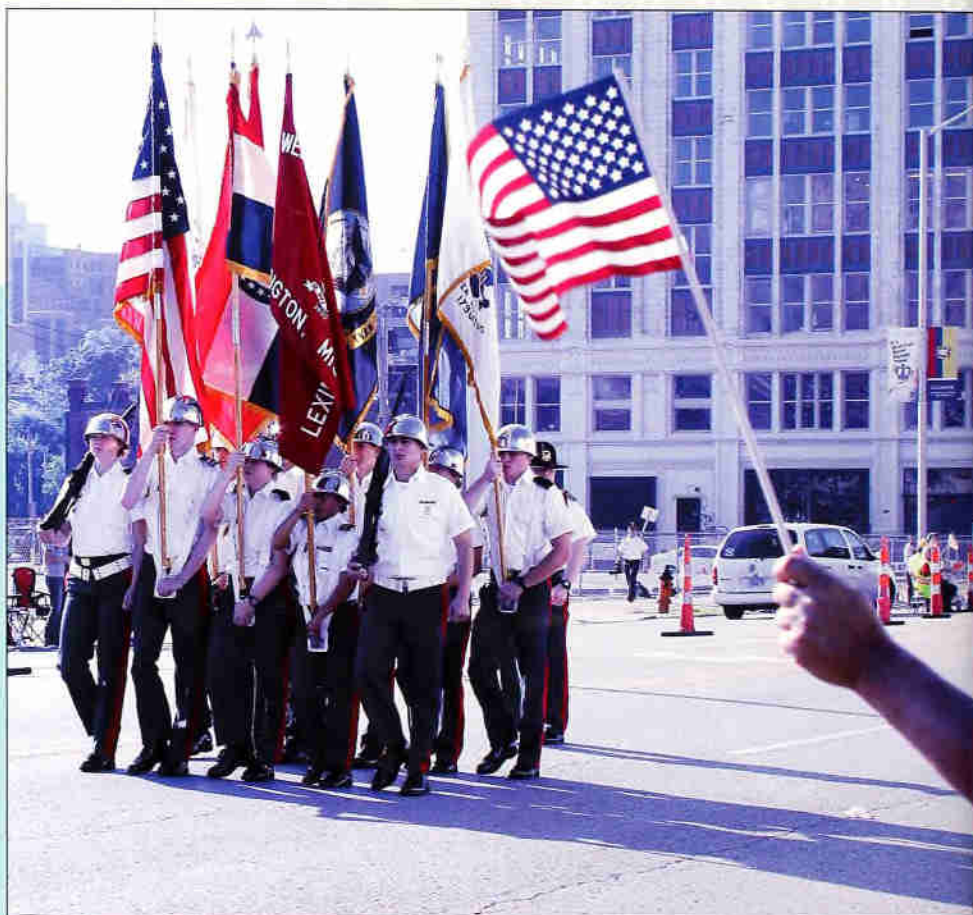
Duty, Honor, Country: Those three hallowed words reverently dictate what you ought to be; what you can be, what you will be. They are your rallying points: to build courage when courage seems to fail; to regain faith when there seems to be little cause for faith; to create hope when hope becomes forlorn. They build your basic character. They mold you for your future roles as the custodians of the nation's defense. They make you strong enough to know when you are weak and brave enough to face yourself when you are afraid. They teach you to be proud and unbending in honest failure, but humble and gentle in success; not to substitute words for actions, not to seek the path of comfort, but to face the stress and spur of difficulty and challenge; to learn to stand up in the storm but to have compassion on those who fail; to master yourself before you seek to master others; to have a heart that is clean, a goal that is high; to learn to laugh yet never forget how to weep; to reach into the future yet never neglect the past; to be serious yet never to take yourself too seriously; to be modest so that you will remember the simplicity of true greatness, the open mind of true wisdom and the meekness of true strength. They give you a temper of the will, a quality of the imagination, a vigor of the emotions, a freshness of the deep springs of life, a temperamental predominance of courage over timidity, an appetite for adventure over love of ease. They create in your heart the sense of wonder, the unfailing hope of what next, and the joy and inspiration of life. They teach you in this way to be an officer and a gentleman.

After each of these words, Duty, Honor, and Country, the cannon is fired.

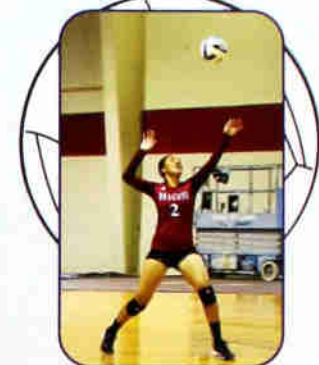

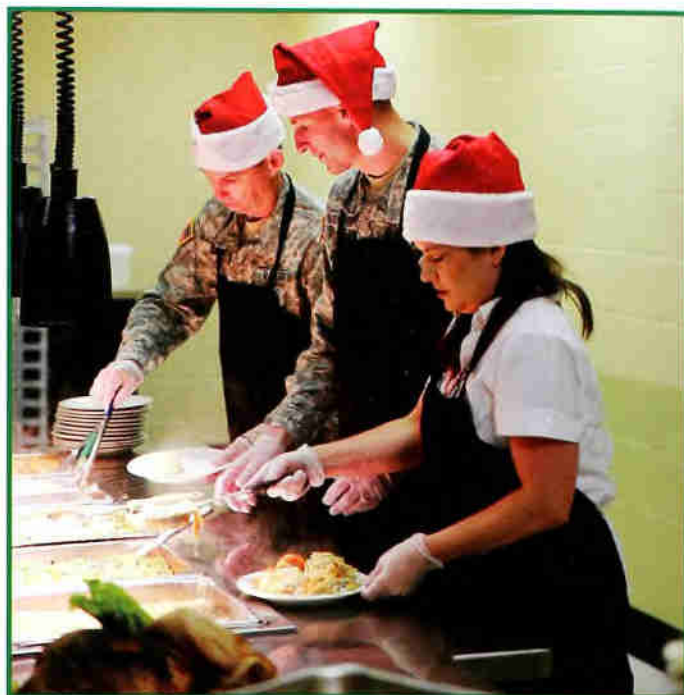

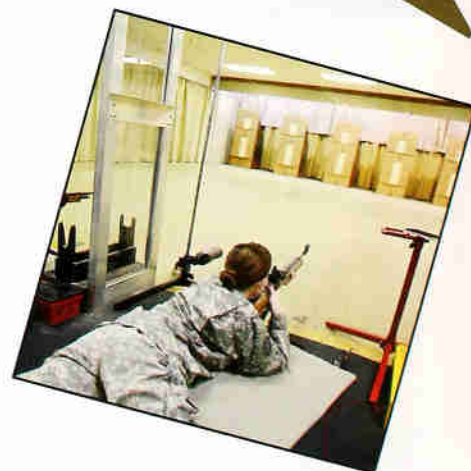

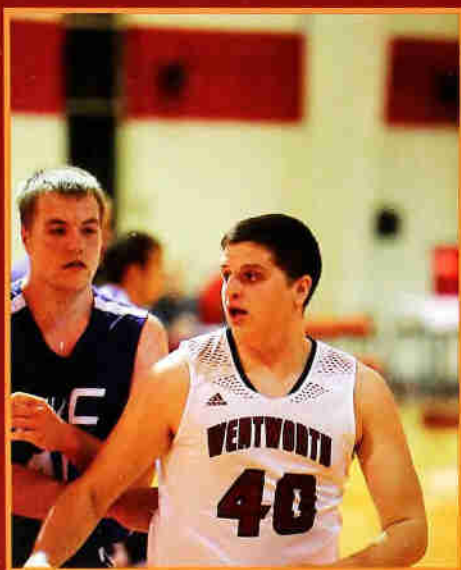

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

For the second time in two years, Shakorya "Coco" Brower earned a spot on the 1st Team All-Region squad. Lexus "Lucky" Wells earned a 2nd Team All-Region selection. Brower, a sophomore, was the Red Dragons leading scorer, chipping it with an 18.2 points per game average. Her scoring average was among leaders in the NJCAA, finishing 23rd in the Nation. She led Wentworth in scoring in nineteen of the Red Dragons twenty-three games. A deadly accurate shooter from the floor, her field goal percent was 50.5%, placing her 41st in the NJCAA. And, she was 66.7% from the charity stripe. Coco led the Red Dragons in rebounding per game (7.4), offensive rebounding per game (2.8), and defensive rebounding per game (4.8). She also led the Red Dragons in assists per game (2.0), steals per game (2.3), and blocks per game (1.1).

Lucky Wells was a 2nd Team All-Region selection. Lucky was the 2nd leading scorer for the Red Dragons, averaging 8.2 points per game. Wells shot 25% from the three point arc, placing her first among the Red Dragons. Lucky was third on the team with a 5.5 rebounds per game average and 1.4 steals per game. Her 33.8% field goal percentage was good for fourth place among the Red Dragons.

The Annual Major Sam Ratcliffe Drill Down



The Annual MAJ Sam Ratcliffe Drill Down has been a tradition at Wentworth Military Academy since 2009. The Drill Down is named after Major Sam Ratcliffe. Major Ratcliffe was an employee at Wentworth for many years before his retirement. While at Wentworth, Major Ratcliffe had many different titles including commandant, instructor, and coach. He is the person who observes the companies and he is the one who decides the final winner of the Drill Down. The winning company of the Drill Down receives a broomstick as their guidon for a week and also receives points that go toward the Bassore Award.

The following is an excerpt from The Story of Wentworth by Raymond Settle which explains the history of the broomstick:

"When the Academy was opened nobody had the slightest idea it would become a military school. This important phase of its work began as a spontaneous, voluntary activity among the students upon the playground in the fall term of the 1881-82 session. Ephriam King, a student who was a member of the local National Guard company known as the Lexington Guards, canvassed the neighborhood for broomsticks, used them to arm a group of lads who were interested in that kind of exercise and taught them the Manual of Arms, squads right, how to march in formation, etc. To Principal Sellers, who saw it all from an upstairs window of the school building, it occurred that here was the solution for the problem of exercise and discipline. Perhaps it also stirred memories of his brief days at Colonel Pope's military school in Waco, Texas. He adopted it and lent every assistance in organizing the students. Wentworth also like the idea. Observing the unmilitary appearance of the students as they drilled with broomsticks and wearing ordinary clothes he proposed that if thirty of them would buy uniforms, he would provide them with guns. They accepted his challenge, ordered the required number, and on July 8, 1882, he presented the Board of Trustees forty Austrian Cadet muskets with bayonets, scabbards and belts and fitted up an armory on the second floor of the school building. On April 11, 1882, the Board of Trustees approved of the plan for military instruction and drill under the supervision of the Principal."

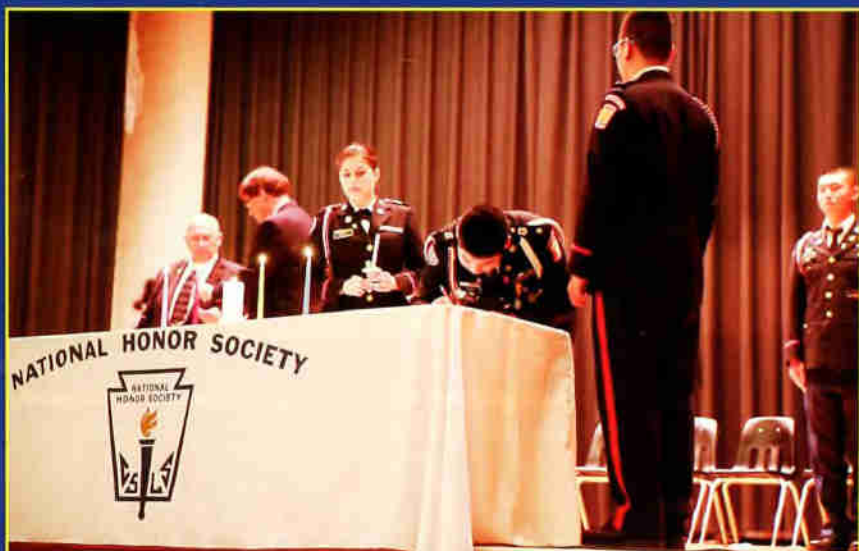

The Flag of the United States Army

Prior to 1956, the Army was the only armed service without a flag to represent the entire service. The U.S. Army flag was dedicated and unfurled to the general public on June 14, 1956 at Independence Hall, Philadelphia, on the 181st anniversary of the establishment of the U.S. Army by the Continental Congress. The flag displays a blue replica of the War Office Seal set on a white background. Beneath it, "United States Army" is inscribed in white letters on a scarlet scroll, with the year "1775" in blue numerals below. This signifies the year in which the Continental Army was created with the appointment of General George Washington as Commander-in-Chief.

The 187 streamers attached to the Army Flag staff denote campaigns fought by the Army throughout our nation's history. Each streamer (2 3/4 inches wide and 4 feet long) is embroidered with the designation of a campaign and the year(s) in which it occurred.

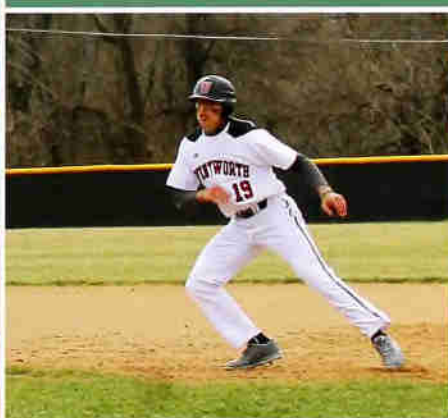
