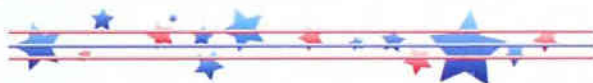


FALCON SCHOLARSHIP CEREMONY

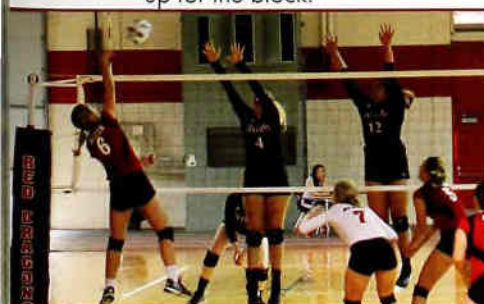

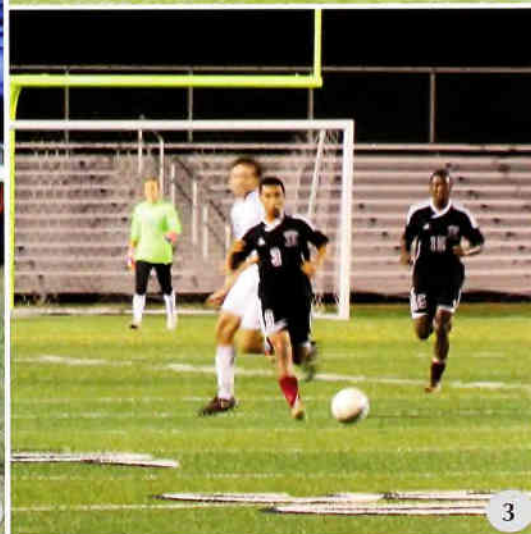

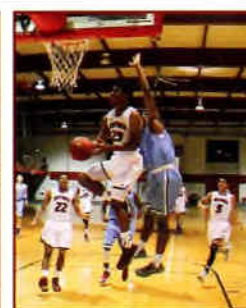

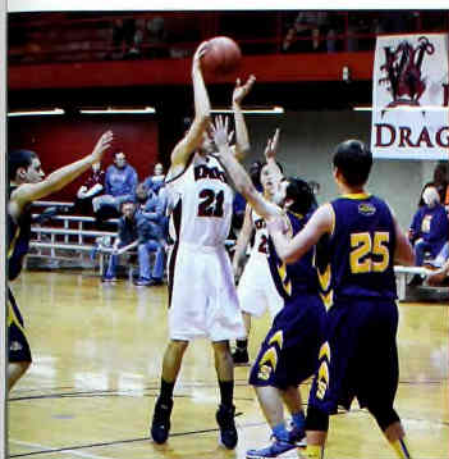

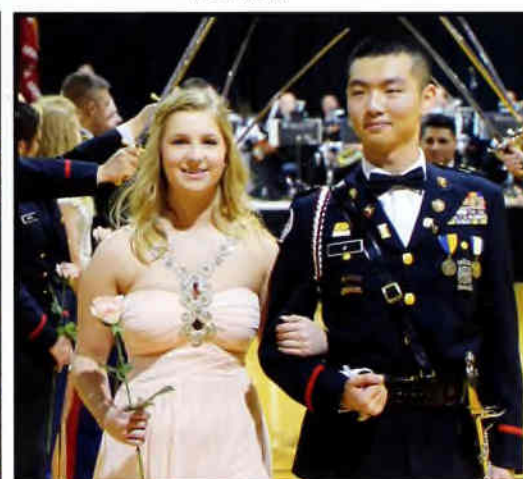

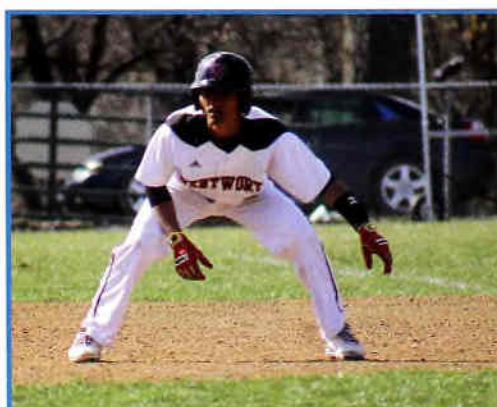

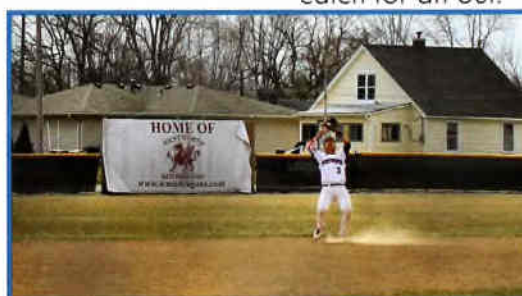
